As we enter the final quarter of measurement*, it is important that you are reviewing your reports to verify your site's compliance with the current quality measures. More than one red X could mean a decreased score on Pay for Performance (P4P) or potentially losing eligibility for Gold Card and CQI VBR in 2024.

*The MROQC Incentive Program measurement period applies to cases with radiotherapy (RT) end dates from January 1st-September 30th

ECOG Status Capture: Now Available on the Bone Mets CDA M1 Form!

We have taken note of your request and are pleased to announce that you will soon be able to report either the patient's KPS or ECOG score on the CDA M1 Bone Mets Baseline Clinical Data form.

You only need to provide one score, and there is no preference for either KPS or ECOG. You can access the updated form on the MROQC website.

16. Select either KPS or ECOG scale, only one type of scoring is required.

Karnofsky Performance Scale (select a response):

100	Normal no complaints; no evidence of disease.
90	Able to carry on normal activity; minor signs or symptoms of disease.
80	Normal activity with effort; some signs or symptoms of disease.
70	Cares for self; unable to carry on normal activity or to do active work.
60	Requires occasional assistance, but is able to care for most of his personal needs.
50	Requires considerable assistance and frequent medical care.
40	Disabled; requires special care and assistance.
30	Severely disabled; hospital admission is indicated although death not imminent.
20	$\label{thm:constraints} \mbox{Very sick; hospital admission necessary; active supportive treatment necessary.}$
10	Moribund; fatal processes progressing rapidly.
