The **Facility Performance Dashboard** launched on the website. This replaces the previously distributed monthly reports.

The **Prostate Matching Dashboard** became available on the website. This is updated with new matching criteria and replaces the retired report.

Enhancing Quality Care: Standardizing Demographic Data Collection in MROQC

The mission of MROQC is to enhance quality through continuous improvement so that we can provide the best possible care for our patients. To do so, we need to collect



the data required to deliver that high-quality care. Over the years in MROQC, we have collected data elements including demographic data to capture those factors that could lead to differences in health outcomes for some patients, with the goal of developing interventions to correct for those differences. With the support of BCBSM, we are now seeking to standardize the demographic data collection using guidelines set forth by the Michigan Social Health Intervention to Eliminate Disparities (MSHIELD).

As shown in the linked forms (below), the additional data to be collected includes information related to race/ethnicity, gender, and the presence of disabilities affecting daily living. We are aware that collecting this information may feel intrusive to some which is why patients will be reminded they may decline participating if they so choose. As with all aspects of MROQC, participation in this survey is completely voluntary. That said, we do hope the majority of patients will elect to provide the information so can we determine whether additional interventions may be helpful to ensure the highest quality of care. Please let us know if you or your patients have questions regarding the collection of this additional information, and how we can help.

We believe collection of this additional information will allow us as a consortium to provide more comprehensive care to our patients as they undergo their cancer treatment.
